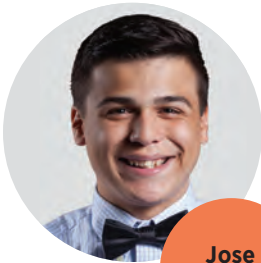

Executive Message



Dear Friends,

Since 2001, Point Foundation has helped LGBTQ students move forward in life despite barriers they face because of financial difficulties and their gender identity and/or sexual orientation. To date, we have invested more than \$18 million in the education and support of our scholars, and developed an intergenerational community of LGBTQ and allied professionals. These achievements inspire the hashtag campaign we are using this year on social media, urging LGBTQ students to #PointTo a college education, #PointTo greater opportunities, and #PointTo a brighter future, by applying for a Point Foundation Scholarship. The forward momentum of Point and our scholars is because of your generosity and that of many visionary supporters. This year, the Elton John AIDS Foundation made it possible for 12 Point Scholars to have internships with non-profit organizations addressing HIV/AIDS awareness and prevention in communities across the U.S.

With support and hands-on help from our directors, trustees, honorary board members, and mentors, we also launched our new Leadership Education and Affinities Development (LEAD) Consortiums this year. Each LEAD Consortium focuses on specific professions, such as business, entertainment, and medicine. LEAD Consortiums offer our scholars and alumni, as well as high school and community college students, skill building opportunities, professional development workshops, and networking.

Point Alumni are at the forefront of change in society and this year we were able to recognize two of them, Rhys Ernst, and Zach Zyskowski, at our Voices On Point celebration. Caitlyn Jenner presented the Point Horizon Award to each for their work in film and television, in particular on groundbreaking shows such as Amazon’s “Transparent” and ABC Family’s “Becoming Us.”

The Point family celebrated the Supreme Court’s historic marriage equality decision in June, a cause many of our scholars and alumni have been involved in as part of their community service and advocacy. Just as important as making history, however, is acknowledging and celebrating history. Point was privileged this year to present civil rights leader David Mixner’s autobiographical stage work “Oh Hell No!” in New York, Los Angeles, Atlanta, and Chicago.

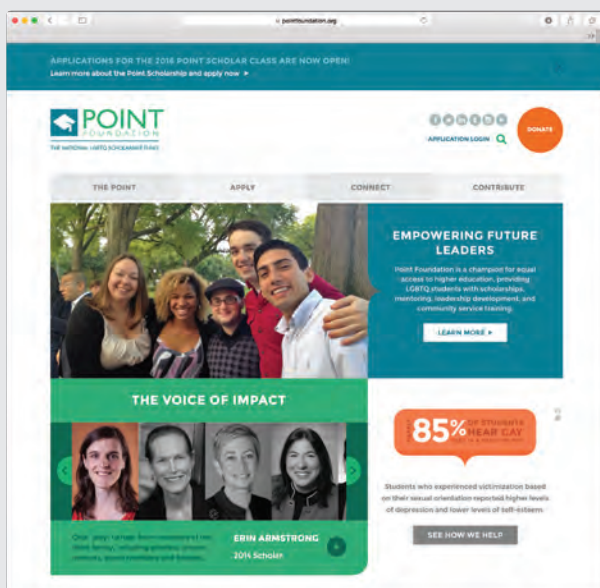

Scholar Support & Selections

A higher education degree became possible for 36 new undergraduate and graduate students who received a Point Foundation Scholarship in 2015. Each recipient demonstrates academic excellence, leadership skills, community involvement, financial need, and the ability to overcome obstacles. The 36 driven and talented young people were chosen from nearly 2,000 scholarship applicants.

For 2015 – 2016, Point is providing financial assistance and programmatic support to 85 students.

Point's support for its scholars extends beyond a direct financial contribution to the cost of their education. Point provides leadership development and training for each scholar and pairs each with a mentor in their professional field or community. Point Scholars give back to the LGBTQ and allied community through the completion of an individual community service project each year.



Audrey is a seven-year Army veteran who has served multiple tours overseas, rising through the ranks to Captain. She earned a B.S. from the United States Military Academy and an M.A. from the University of Texas at El Paso. She grew up in a multiracial family and was often the only minority child in her classes and extracurricular activities. At the United States Military Academy, she studied under the “Don’t Ask Don’t Tell” policy and saw firsthand the effects it had on her classmates. Today, as a transgender woman of color, she is acutely aware of the intersectional marginalization felt by many members of the LGBTQ community.

Growing up in a small town near New Orleans, Louisiana, Julian Turner experienced racism, homophobia, and discrimination. As a result, he had begun to make his community more knowledgeable about the struggles LGBTQ youth face. In his senior year of high school, Julian started his area's very first gay-straight alliance. After years of battling depression in the process of finding himself, Julian decided that he would use his experiences to help others have a more peaceful process of self-acceptance.

Shane aspires to work as a primary care physician caring for LGBTQ patients.

Leadership

This year Point launched its new Leadership Education and Affinities Development (LEAD) Consortiums. The LEAD Consortiums gathered scholars, alumni, board directors and trustees, mentors, and high school and community college students for interactive skill building, professional development workshops, and networking. The inaugural LEAD Consortium in Los Angeles focused on the arts, communications, and entertainment fields. Nearly 30 young people enjoyed the spring weekend program that included job shadowing, showcases of scholar and alumni work, and conversational breakout sessions. Guest speakers included professionals from Entertainment Tonight, GLAAD, National Alliance for Media Arts and Culture, NBCUniversal, Queer Lounge, SAG-AFTRA, SoJust, and UCLA College for the Arts and Sciences.

The Business, Consulting & Finance LEAD Consortium took place in New York City in July. The program kicked off with a dynamic presentation by Dennis Williams, HBO Vice President, Corporate Social Responsibility. Scholars then spent half a day in job shadows before visiting the trading floor at Wells Fargo. The visit to Wells Fargo also included lunch and presentations about financial education. Other instructional sessions and panels during the weekend included participation by board members and alumni, as well as representatives of Accenture, the Barclays Center, Emblem Health, Immigration Equality, KPMG, PwC, and Time Warner.

Kylie earned her B.A. in 2009 and M.S.W. in 2012, both from New York University. Since 2012, Kylie has worked as a psychotherapist at Callen-Lorde Community Health Center in New York City. Over 95 percent of Kylie's clients identify along the LGBT spectrum. Kylie has facilitated support groups for women of trans experience and has worked in various capacities with the LGBT community in Haiti and the Dominican Republic. Her studies at Yale School of Management will help advance her startup business, Urban Sari, which will bring saris to nontraditional markets in the U.S. and help Indian handweavers stay competitive by offering them novel means to reach untapped markets.

Alexa grew up in Bloomington, Minnesota. In 2011, she began volunteering with Minnesotans United for All Families, a group created to defeat a proposed amendment to the Minnesota Constitution that would prohibit same-sex marriage. After the successful defeat of the amendment in November 2012, Alexa continued to work with Minnesotans United on their successful campaign to pass a marriage equality bill in the state, taking on a leadership position in her region. During the 2013-2014 school year, Alexa focused her efforts on the issue of bullying, working to pass a comprehensive anti-bullying bill and plan a one-day conference for students focused on youth empowerment.



Community Service

Point Foundation helps our scholars develop the skills they need to become leaders in their respective professions and communities. Every year, Point Scholars complete a Community Service Project (CSP) that positively affects the LGBTQ community. CSPs provide invaluable community-based, partnership-oriented civic engagement. CSPs this past year included a retreat for undergraduates to discuss social identity, helping high school activists and organizers improve urban schools, and empowering transgender patients in health care.

Sarah is a social worker by profession and a community organizer by practice. She graduated Summa Cum Laude and with Honors from Syracuse University in 2004 and was the first social work major selected as both Class Marshall and a Syracuse University Scholar. She practiced social work in London, England and worked for UNICEF in Jamaica before graduating with her M.S.W. from the University of Michigan in 2007. She helped to create the Mississippi Safe Schools Coalition, a youth-led organization that supports and organizes LGBTQ youth and allies. She is pursuing a Ph.D. in social work at the University of Alabama, where she is also a Graduate Council Fellow.

Mentoring

Each Point Scholar is paired with a mentor, a prominent and caring professional in the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and straight-allied community. Point Mentors become important role models for scholars and assist their scholars with their community service projects. Mentors advise scholars on career decisions, including the pursuit of graduate studies, job opportunities, and networking. Point provides each mentor-scholar pair with a mentoring handbook and mentor-training forums and keeps in touch through the Mentoring Messenger newsletter. Mentors are also encouraged to join scholars, alumni, board members, and trustees at leadership programs and other events.

Internships

This year Elton John AIDS Foundation (EJAF) partnered with Point to launch the first year-round internship program, making it possible for 12 Point Scholars to experience relevant, professional work directly benefiting LGBTQ community non-profit organizations working to end HIV/AIDS. Because EJAF generously underwrites a stipend for the scholar, the participating nonprofits do not incur any costs for having a gifted student work with them. A primary goal of the 12 EJAF funded internships is to increase the number of culturally competent, affordable providers working within the LGBTQ community of HIV-positive and high-risk individuals. The impact of this work was felt nationwide, as interns completed projects in Alabama, California, Georgia, Illinois, Massachusetts, New York, Pennsylvania, and Tennessee. For example, Point Scholars Sarah Young and Atticus DeProspero worked with Birmingham AIDS Outreach on a grant to expand LGBTQ and HIV services to youth, and in San Francisco Point Scholar Erin Armstrong created a systems gaps assessment at the Transgender Law Center specifically focused on the needs of transgender women of color.

Point is especially grateful to The Palette Fund for a sixth year of funding nonprofit internships for Point Scholars.

Isaias was raised in a predominantly low-income Latino community in Southeast Los Angeles by his Mexican immigrant parents. Isaias came out in his sophomore year of high school and eventually becoming president of his school's Gay-Straight Alliance Club. Isaias empowered hundreds of youth as they fought homophobia in their schools, and lobbied for legislation in Sacramento that would create safer schools. He also attended the first-ever U.N. Consultation on anti-LGBTQ bullying in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Isaias is the first in his family to attend college and hopes to continue to fight for social justice.

Thanks to the generous support of the Elton John AIDS Foundation, Isaias was able to complete a summer-long internship with LifeWorks in Los Angeles.

“For my internship, I partnered with LifeWorks at the Los Angeles LGBT Center to develop a comprehensive, and culturally competent safe sex curriculum for LGBTQ youth of color. Because some are financially unstable or homeless, I believe comprehensive education surrounding safe sex and HIV/AIDS is essential to reducing transmission rates and stigma. I’m proud that the curriculum will continue to be part of LifeWorks’ programming.”

She traveled to South Africa as a Fulbright Scholar, where she received an M.A. from the University of Cape Town. Naomi completed an M.F.A. at the Iowa Writers' Workshop of the University of Iowa. She was awarded the 2013-2014 Maytag Fellowship for Excellence in Fiction from the University of Iowa and the Arts-Edge Residency at the University of Pennsylvania's Kelly Writers House. Her debut novel, "The Star Side of Bird Hill," was published by Penguin Press in June 2015.

Financials

The Annual Report presents a summary of the financial position of Point Foundation as of June 30, 2015. Each year, the Board of Directors engages an independent and accredited audit firm to review the financial and accounting practices of Point Foundation and to provide an independent Auditor's Report. This year, the audit was conducted by Green Hasson & Janks LLP, 10990 Wilshire Blvd. 16th Floor, Los Angeles, CA 90024-3929. The Foundation has received unqualified opinions on the Foundation's financial statements since its inception. The audits are conducted in accordance with U.S. generally accepted auditing standards. An audit also includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements and includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation.
